How Does Your Garden Grow?

That, of course, was the question addressed to “Mary, Mary, quite contrary”! I’m sure you remember her from your childhood! But if one were to ask people today, “how does your garden grow?”, several different answers may be possible. But an increasing number of people would have to reply with a counter-question: “What garden? I live in a high-rise unit, and a garden is not possible”.



A Community Garden is not a totally new idea, although it may seem as if it is. Earlier this year CKCC agreed to such a project, and we secured a small grant to get us started. If you look at the garden near the Henry Street boundary, you will see the beginnings of our project. Why might we set out to do this? There are several reasons.

Importantly, it brings people together, as we see in the picture; and for those who might lack the needed skill or “know-how”, that sense of community is most important. It means that those who live in a high-rise apartment are able to be included in a way that enables them to enjoy the garden, and maybe some fresh vegetables! We already have some indications of interest from the community. It becomes another means of outreach.

More than that, community gardens have become one of the means at our disposal in caring for creation. The impact of such a garden can be very significant, as it was, for example, at Eden in southern NSW; the small UC congregation established its “Garden of Eden” as part of its eco-mission, and its impact in lots of other related areas was very great. In addition to a garden for vegetables or flowers, it can also take the form of a space for spiritual reflection and contemplation, which in turn can impact positively on community well-being and health. It doesn’t have to be large, but through the use of strategically placed signs, people may be better able to connect faith and the natural world.

We are delighted that Rob Anscombe has agreed to be the Project Convenor, and we hope that you will share the vision of what such a project could mean for our Church and community. This is something that needs to be “owned” by us all.


WELCOME TO WORSHIP

Notes from CHURCH COUNCIL Oct 2018

Arrangements for December, Christmas and January

A calendar has been prepared and will be available. Our Sunday worship arrangements will be for one service only at 9am for all of December and January.

There will be a bookshop from Koorong available from Sunday 18th November for 4 Sundays and including the Christmas market days in the first week of December.

Our charity for this Christmas season will be the Christmas Bowl.

Rev Clive Ayre is not currently a Minister in Association at CKCC as this arrangement has to be renegotiated with each new ministry team. We thank Rev Clive for his serving in this role while Rev Glenn was here and appreciate all that he and his wife Gail contribute to the life of our congregation.

CKCC was happy to host a Godly Play training workshop here recently for 23 people from several states.

Rob Ancombe has agreed to be the co-ordinator of the CKCC Community Garden. The City Council grant money has to be accounted for in mid-November so work is moving on very quickly to get the work done.

A local Uniting Care financial advisor is regularly available at CKCC; appointments with him may be made at the church office.

Finance a new electricity supply contract has been negotiated with AGL with significant savings on our enormous electricity bill.

The 2019 budget will be formulated in the next few months. Any requests, comments or suggestions should be forwarded to Kendall. The Moderator has communicated with congregations and Uniting Church schools and agencies regarding the funding of redress in cases of abuse where recompense has been agreed following the Royal Commission. CKCC will be required to contribute after July next year and the amount is currently unknown. If you wish to know more, a document is available; please ask Pauline.


